

2004 ANNUAL MEETING

These are the minutes of the Annual Meeting of the Town of Bass Lake held on Tuesday, April 13, 2004. Members present: Chairperson Sanders, Supervisors Meixner and Nies, Treasurer Aderman and Clerk Miller.

Sanders called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

There were 35 town persons in attendance.

The clerk read the minutes of the 2003 Annual meeting, there was then a motion by Shirley Suhsen, seconded by Helen Chevrier to accept the report. Motion carried.

Meixner, Nies and Aderman read the 2003 Financial Statement. Meixner asked if there were any questions. Helen Chevrier questioned what the 2nd half of taxes were. Aderman explained that is what the county gives us back in August. There was then a motion by Nancy Grothe to accept the report, seconded by Dick Hawkins. Motion carried.

Discussions took place in regards to which roads were going to be done this year. Several of the roads are in bad condition. Nies stated that when they do the road inspection the end of this month they will see which roads need to be done.

Jerry Brueggen questioned if a stop sign could be placed at Lincoln and Scipio. Nies explained that a counter would need to be placed on the road to see if it warranted a stop sign. Froemel, highway crew chief will do this

Suhsen asked about certain stop signs. One on Dixon Ave, and also the stop signs at Lakeshore and Scipio. Froemel, Highway Crew Chief will check into this.

Brueggen expressed concern in regards to homes in the area that are in very poor condition. Siding not being completed and debris scattered all over the property. Sanders explained that the town does send letters and a copy of the town's nuisance ordinance to the owner requesting them to clean up the property and if it is not done we do take them to court. Sanders also stated that persons need to attend the Sawyer County Zoning meetings and express their concerns to see rules and ordinances changed.

Helen Chevrier questioned who sets the fees for the town's building inspector. Sanders informed her that Steve Boss, the town's inspector sets his own fees with town approval.

Complaints about dogs running at large were heard. Sanders informed the people that they should contact Sherie Shelton the County's Dog control person.

There being no further business to be brought before the board, there was a motion by Russ Iverson, seconded by Dorothy Brueggen to adjourn at 8:00 p.m. Motion carried.
